# Q&A

## QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

### How does the Sale work?

Every individual/business will have the opportunity to bid on each animal. Large animals are sold by the pound with small animals being sold by pen or lot to the highest bidder.

### If I am the winning bidder, what happens?

Arrangements will be made to take the animal to the processing plant of your choice. It is your responsibility to contact the processing plant for cutting instructions, pick-up of packaged meat and payment options.

Other options include taking advantage of the buy-back program or you can donate processed meat to a non-profit organization of your choice.

### Where does the money go?

Youth exhibitors use proceeds from the sale to cover expenses incurred for their project and to prepare for next years project. Any excess money is used to help youth with College and career opportunities.

The proceeds from past sales have provided the opportunity for youth to pay for college tuitions, room and board, book fees and various other career building experiences.
